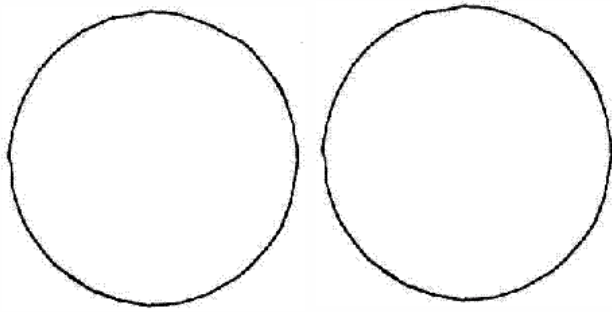


CIRCLE BOOK

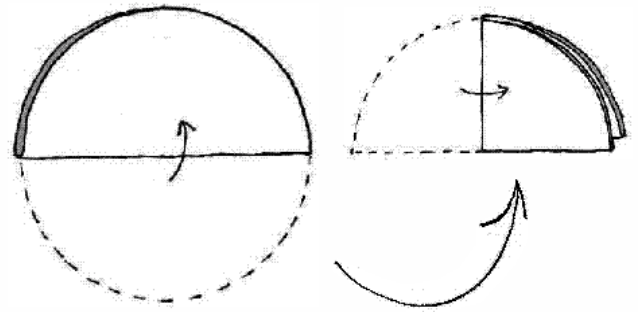
(IT KEEPS ON OPENING)



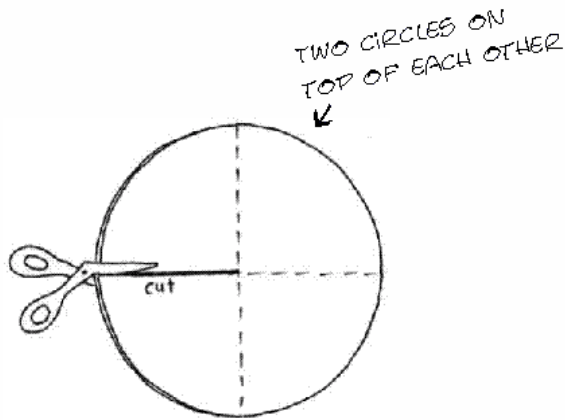
This book keeps on opening in a surprising way. The directions here show how to make the book with two circles, but you can also make it with three, four or more circles.



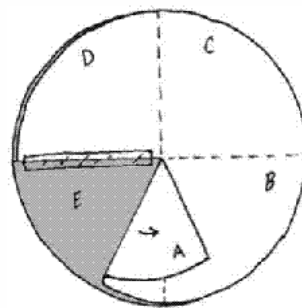
1. Trace and cut out two paper circles. (Good sizes are anywhere from 4 to 8 inches in diameter.)



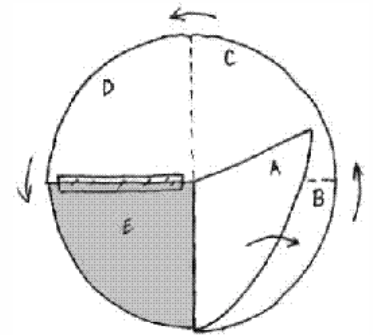
2. Fold both of the circles in fourths.



3. Unfold both circles. Lay them on top of each other. Cut **through both circles** on one fold line. Stop at the center as shown.

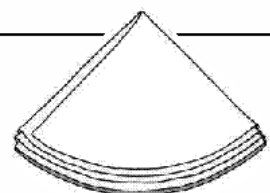


4. With circles still together, tape the cut edge of **quarter D** (top circle) to the cut edge of **quarter E** (bottom circle) as shown. To make this easier, fold the **quarter A** (top circle) out of the way.



5. Fold the quarter sections as shown. A on top of B; A and B on top of C and so forth. If you did it correctly, you will have a pie shaped book when you are done folding.

Good names for a new kind of snack

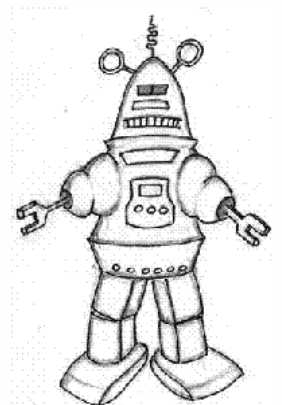
