

LITERATURE BASED ACTIVITY: (POETRY)

Read "Bleezer's Ice Cream" on p. 48 of The New Kid on the Block by Jack Prelutsky. This is a delightful poem listing some outrageous ice cream flavors. Kids love the unlikely juxtapositions of tastes. After the kids hear this poem they will be motivated to invent some ice cream concoctions of their own. This can also be an opportunity to introduce the concept of "alliteration". Children can submit these newly invented flavors to be published in the next issue.


Jack Prelutsky Tongue Twisters (using alliterations)

Definition: Alliteration: When two or more words in a row start with the same letter. We also call that **Fun-to-say**.
Tongue twisters tangle, twist, turn, twirl and twangle your tongue.

Make some tongue twisters using alliterations.
